### A MESSAGE FROM Fr. JOHN

Dear Friends,

In the Book of Ecclesiastes, the writer speaks about time. It is hard to believe that I am in my tenth year in the parish, how time goes quickly. I had wanted to have this letter to you before I went away but that was not possible, due to a number of factors. Time has come for me to take up another appointment.

We have a great Parish and the Holy Spirit is certainly present, enabling us to be a parish that is looking outwards to being a missionary Church. I have been inspired by how you all live your faith, in how you have said yes to being a community that welcomes. Recently I had an appointment with the Vicar General to talk about my time here, my health and what might be my next move. The main reason for my decision to take another appointment is my mental health and wellbeing. This is something you may not be aware of. I may have seemed calm on the outside, but the size and business of the parish has taken its toll. I can no longer keep up the pace at which the parish of this size requires. I have loved every minute of my time with you and thought that it would go on for another few years, but for my wellbeing I need to step down as parish priest and seek a parish that is smaller. It does break my heart to leave, I have felt loved and at home among you all.

I have been appointed to the Parish of Woodend and the Parish of Lancefield/Romsey. The Parish consists of three churches and two small schools. I take up this new appointment on July 10<sup>th</sup>. As part of this process of discernment I have also decided to take some holidays early. I will return from holidays on 24<sup>th</sup> May.

Please know that I have prayed and thought seriously about this decision. Let us pray for each other over these next few months.
